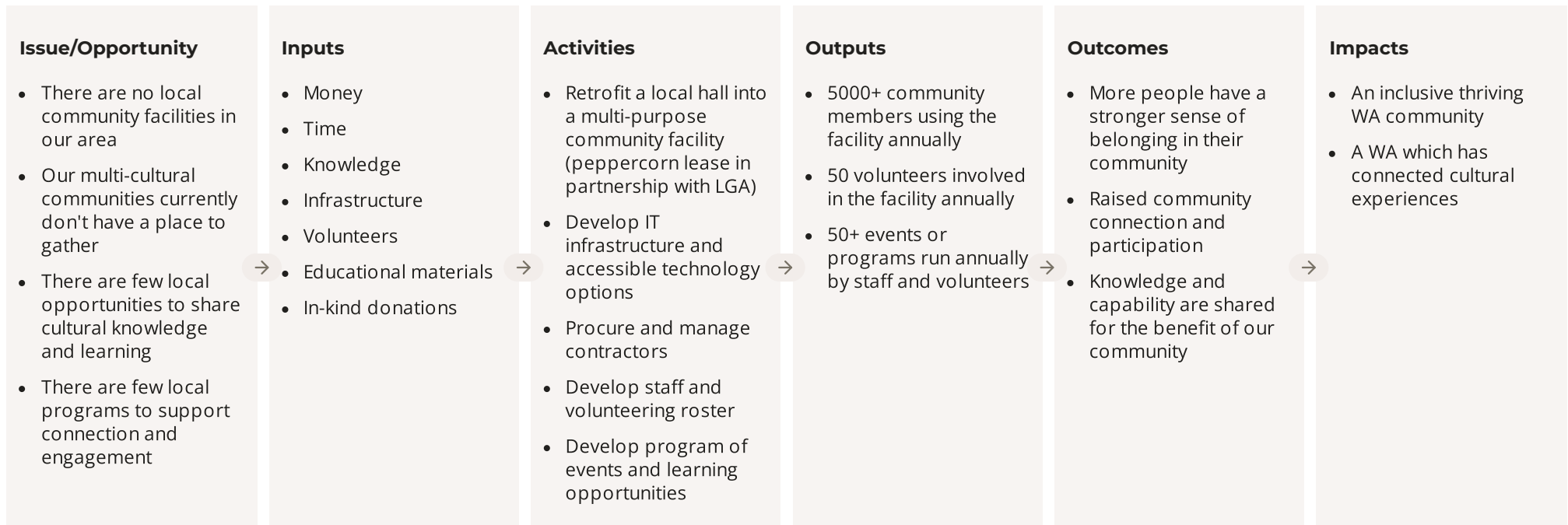
Theory of Change
