

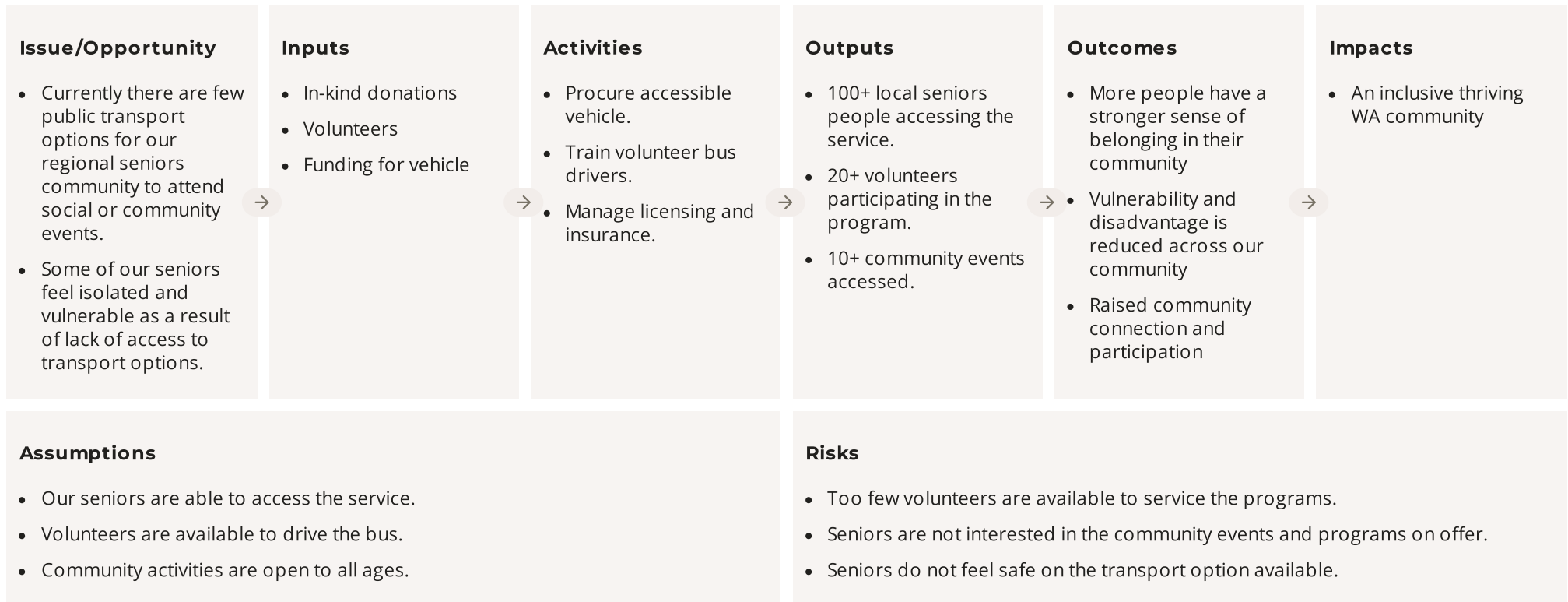
## Theory of Change
